## FOREWORD

Dear Friend of Liberty,

We left a busy year behind as Freedom Research Association and we've seen many tense events in 2018.

In the beginning of the 2018, the operation "Zeytin Dalı" was launched against the armed Kurdish groups in the NorthernSyria. This operation showed us that a really tough year is ahead of us. The General Election of Turkey 2018, the Pastor Andrew Brunson crisis and the historical fall of the Turkish lira against the American Dollar /Euro were the most important issues in the domestic policy this year.

After the change of the government system, the first general election of Turkey has been held on 24th of June 2018. To hold an election under the State of Emergency sparked serious controversy about the freedom of speech, fair and competitive elections and the increasing power of the executive branch.

The first President of the new government system has become Recep Tayyip Erdoğan who is also the president of the ruling government party, Justice and Develpment Party (AKP). The new government system has created a dozen regulations which made the president and the executive branch much stronger than the legislative and the judiciary branches. To



appoint the ministers, the members of the higher courts and an indefinite number of vice presidents are now among the authorities of the president. The annual state budget, previously set by the parliament, is now drafted by the president. However, it must be approved by the parliament. If it is rejected, the previous year's budget will be used with an increase of the revaluation rate.. Therefore, now the government system must be watched carefully to establish a functioning checks and balances mechanism.

The State of Emergency was extended 7 times and is finally abolished on 19th of July 2018. The executive branch had extraordinary powers throughout the State of Emergency. The executive branch used the emergency decrees to disable the legislative and judicial branches. After the state of emergency, the expectation was the political agenda going back to usual business along with the power of the executive branch.. However, due to the law numbered 7145, the most dangerous powers of the government under the State of Emergency has been made ordinary regulations for three years. The most worrying implications of this law have been expanding the custody period and the authority of the governors and the power of the public institutions which allows them to suspend all the public servants without any accusation.

The last year has been really threatening for the civil society organizations. Open Society Foundation was forced to withdraw from Turkey because of excessive and unfounded claims about their work in Turkey which they served for 18 years. The international institutions are established legally and their works and budgets are audited by the public authorities. Even so, pro-government media has made hundreds of manipulative and false accusations about them. These news have increased the pressure on the international institutions and their local partners. Moreover, almost every group in Turkey have an international partner, but the pro-government media has targeted only the opponent groups.

One of the most important events of the last year was the emergence of the current economic crisis. After the crisis of the Pastor Brunson, President Trump started to impose sanctions on Turkey.

In a time that all the economies in the world are fragile, having a crisis with the United States has led to a sudden crisis in the Turkey's economy. As a result, the Turkish lira lost %40 of his value against the US dollar and the gold. Turkish people have suffered from a huge inflation rate and increasing prices.

2018 has been a very dramatic year for our country as well as for the rest of the world. US President Trump has moved the US Embassy in Israel's capital, Tel Aviv to Jerusalem, withdrawn from the nuclear weapons treaty with Iran, re-imposed sanctions on Iran. All these cases with the decision of withdrawal from Syria have created a new anxious wait in our region.

Despite all these difficulties, 2018 has had a few promising cases. For the first time in the United States, a homosexual candidate has been selected as a state governor also two Muslim candidates have been selected as members to the US Congress. For the first time in the history of Saudi Arabia, women gained the right to drive. The first peace talks between the South and North Korea have started.

We have been creating public policy proposals and educating the future generations with the basis of the liberal values to establish the rule of law, pluralistic democracy and to promote the human rights in Turkey since 2014. For the first time in the history of Turkey, our country has been categorised as a "unfree country" by the Freedom House. This means we have been experiencing a time when we need to promote our freedom more than ever.

Dear friend of liberty, we will continue to defend liberties in a principle manner in 2019 as FRA. Your support is crucial for us in this struggle. We hope that your support will continue in 2019. We will work with all our power to be worthy of your support.

# **2018 IN A NUTSHELL**





## **VISION AND MISSION**

Freedom Research Association (FRA) was founded in August 2014 by a group of academics, business people, journalists and legal experts to conduct public policy research with a liberal and scientific approach. FRA envisions a free and prosperous Turkey. The mission of FRA is to promote evidence-based policy making among decision-makers and an informed public debate in Turkey. Freedom Research Association is strongly dedicated to individual liberties, rule of law, peace, fair and competitive markets. We believe that a free and prosperous Turkey can only be founded upon universal human rights, rule of law and a competitive free market economy which deters cronyism. "Institutional Reform" is a key focus area of FRA's research. Main aims of FRA's projects on this area are as follows: To explore the suitable ground on which Turkey's institutions can operate with reference to universal standards To propose necessary reforms which need to be done in processes and structures, based on international best case examples.

## **CORPORATE STRATEGY**

FRA focuses on universal and scientific ethical standards in its work. They formulate their work as inclusive as possible and in accordance with scientific ethical standards. FRA is strictly independent and non-partisan. In order to protect its independence, FRA doesn't accept public funds from state institutions in accordance with its by-law. Transparency and honesty are taken as the basis both for the internal affairs and public relations.

#### The rules that FRA has determined to ensure the quality of its research are as follows:

- The main aim and the purpose of the research should be clearly explained.
- The method of the study should be well formulated and applied throughout the research.
- The research should provide information/references about the other field works.
- The research should be based on the most current and valid data available.

- · The theses suggested in the research should be clear and justified.
- The research should improve the knowledge that exists in the field.
- All researches should bring inclusive policy recommendations.
- The theses proposed in the research and the proposed policy recommendation should be consistent with the method and findings of the research.
- · All theses and suggestions should be well explained and the weaknesses /deficiencies of the research (if any) should be indicated.
- · The resulting reports should be well structured, clear and understandable.
- · The language used in the research reports should be objective, inclusive, constructive and equidistant to different views.
- · As long as it does not contradict scientific ethical values and the principles of the FRA, no content of any research is intervened based on freedom of opinion.
- Editorial interventions are the exception to this rule.

## **GENERAL PROCESS IN THE FRA RESEARCH**

## **IDENTIFICATION OF PORBLEMS**

To bring together the stakeholders who are relevant to the research topic or the researched institution. The content, limitations and method of the research are determined in accordance with the feedback from these discussion(s).

In the research process, the research team guided by a specialist will identify the problems in the field, their causes and their effects and explore international good examples. The results of the research will be presented as a solution to the problem identified at the beginning of the research.

## **RESEARCH PROCESS**

## ANNOUNCEMENT OF RESULTS TO THE PUBLIC

Organizing a conference, seminar or press conference where the results will be announced to the public. The research team (or its representative) shares the findings and outcomes of the research with the public.

The final report will be shared with the relevant departments of the universities, public institutions and organizations, media companies and relevant non-governmental organizations. Going to the GRAND NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF TURKEY (t to share policy proposals with the MP's

# RULE OF LAW ACADEMY PROJECT

## Rule of Law Academy Project

In the last month of 2017, we launched a new project entitled "Rule of Law Academy."

The main purpose of this project is to strengthen the foundations of the rule of law in Turkey. The rule of law rises on three pillars: institutions (first level courts, high courts and administrative bodies); rules and regulations; and finally, human capital (judges, prosecutors, lawyers). Turkey's record of performance is not satisfactory with respect to any of these pillars. In this Project, we will focus on the third pillar, human capital. It is possible to approach to the pillar of human capital from several diferent angles. One approach may be to train the current judges, prosecutors and lawyers. A second approach may be to train the current students of law who will become judges, prosecutors and lawyers tomorrow. A third approach may be to educate tomorrow's legal scholars and academics who will educate





the future generations of judges, prosecutors and lawyers. We will take the third approach which we believe to have the highest added value.

We will bring graduate students of law faculties together with some of the most respected legal scholars of Turkey in a structured colloquium. The participants will be selected on the basis of questionnaires and letters of intent. The selected participants (20 persons) will be sent a reading package prepared by our team of legal scholars. The reading materials will consist of both the classical writings on the matter and writings penned by the team. The colloquiums will last two days. There will be three sessions each day, totalling six sessions. After the completion of the colloquia, the participants will be asked to write a publishable paper on a different aspect of the rule of law. Each participant will be assigned to a scholar. The scholars will give feedback to students. At the end of six months, students will submit their papers. Our team of scholars will encourage and lead students to submit their papers to respected journals for publication. This format will be repetaed in four major cities of Turkey.


### Rule of Law Academy Project - Colloquium in Ankara

#### Mass Surveillance Conference 2018 – #MSConf2018

We organized the conference in Istanbul on 28-29 September with the support of the European Liberal Forum (ELF), Friedrich Naumann Foundation – Turkey (FNF-Turkey), International Democratic Initiative (IDI), International Republican Institute (IRI).

This event provided a forum for the presentation and discussion of potential short-term implications of the use of mass surveillance technologies on the rights and freedoms of individuals, the possible policy infrastructure options that would best respond to privacy vs. security dilemma; acceptability and applicability of surveillance technologies on security issues and how to maintain civil rights, responsibility and individual autonomy in the face of the increased capacity of states to interfere with our lives.

In addition to the above, the conference created an excellent opportunity for networking and established a sustainable network of partner and stakeholder organizations who are already or potentially involved with the conference themes.

## **ROUNDTABLE MEETINGS**

Turkey's Economy and the New Economy Program: Opportunities and Impasses

We organized two roundtable meetings in Ankara and İstanbul on 3rd and 24th of November with the support of the Friedrich Naumann Foundation – Turkey (FNF- Turkey) and the International Republican Institute (IRI).

The meetings, which included academics, politicians, journalists and expert economists, were moderated by Dr Nesrin Nas and Prof Murat Çokgezen. At the meeting, the participants discussed the reasons of the current economic crisis, the short and long term solutions and the New Economy Program.

## LIBERAL PERSPECTIVE: COMMENTARY

Commentaries are short articles reflecting a liberal perspective written by our experts, on a public policy related topic, 3-5 pages long.

Last year we published one commentary.

## 1. Do We Need Secularism to Experience Freedom of Conscience? Yes, We Do: A Liberal Approach Prof. Bican Şahin

In this essay Prof. Bican Şahin discusses the need for a secular legal and political realm if individuals experience their freedom of religion and conscience. To this aim, he first discusses the concept of liberty/freedom and provides Isaiah Berlin's distinction between the negative and positive forms of it. Secondly, he presents freedom of conscience and religion as a form of negative liberty. It is argued that this freedom can be enjoyed in the best possible way only in a secular legal/political framework. Thirdly, he discusses whether it is possible to have freedom of conscience in a theocratic system. Finally, he presents a liberal secular utopia where all different conscientious beliefs coexist with one another on the basis of mutual toleration.





## LIBERAL PERSPECTIVE: ANALYSIS

An analysis is an in-depth investigation of a public-policy issue from a liberal perspective, based on data and research, generally 20-30 pages long. Last year we published two analyses.

## 1. *Liberal Justice and Economic Freedom* Prof. Mustafa Erdoğan

Prof. Mustafa Erdoğan analyzes the economic freedom as a fundamental value of a liberal society in this treatise.

## LIBERAL PERSPECTIVE: REPORT

Our reports are generally prepared after a lengthy research process (3-5 months) on a public policy issue and include extensive reform proposals to the government in that particular area. Last year we published two reports.

#### 1. The Economic Freedom in Turkey

Prof. Murat Çokgezen, Assoc. Prof. Ali Rıza Çoban, Prof. Uğur Emek and Prof. Cengiz Bahçekapılı have prepared the detailed final report of the "Economic Freedom Audit of Turkey".


## Check and Balances Network (CBN)


## FRA's 4th Anniversary Reception

#### TransatlanticLab – The Policy Network




#### **Summer University**
